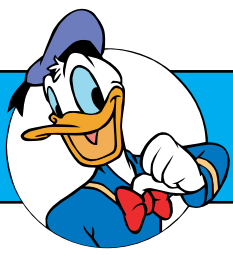

New Disney Character Meet and Greet Coming to WDW

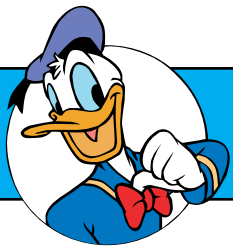


As we reported on Facebook late last month there is a new character coming to the Walt Disney World Resort for a meet and greet in October.

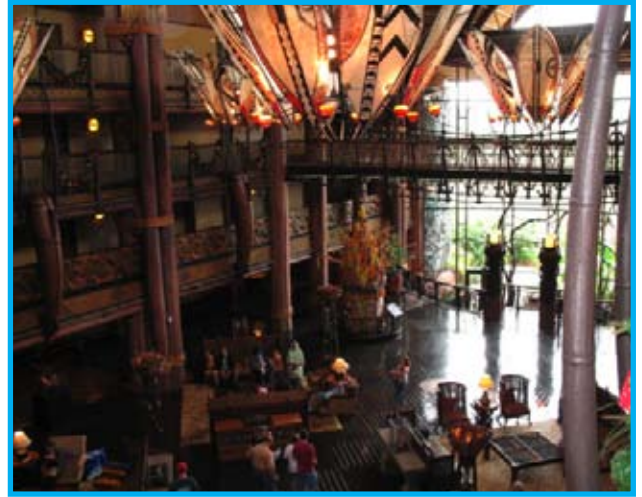
Expect to start seeing Duffy in Epcot sometime in October. As more information becomes available we will pass it along to you on Facebook and Twitter.

Animal Kingdom Lodge

The Animal Kingdom Lodge is perhaps the best hotel on the Walt Disney World complex. Spectacular scenery and interior design instantly whisks hotel guests into a world of African charm. In fact the Animal Kingdom Lodge is known to be favored by celebrity clientele for their family visits to Disney World.



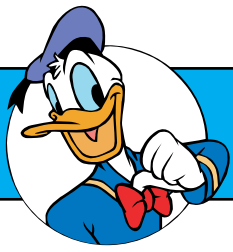
The earthy decorative tones, and authentic African artifacts makes the Animal Kingdom Lodge feel incredibly warm and inviting.

Staying at the Animal Kingdom Lodge gives the convenience of staying on a Disney World Site without being surrounded by Disney themes.

The Animal Kingdom Lodge has a charm that appeals to both adults and children. The animals striding across the savannahs in the morning and evening enthrall all age groups and it is a welcome change from hustle and bustle of the Disney theme parks. The Animal Kingdom Lodge is little part of Africa that Disney got exactly right. It is relaxing and inviting and transports you to world that seems thousands of miles away from Mickey Mouse and Donald Duck, and yet guests are only a few short minutes away by shuttle bus to all the major Disney theme parks. The Animal Kingdom Lodge could stand along as super hotel outside of Disney and would still be worth a visit.

One of the great things about staying at the Animal Kingdom lodge or any Disney hotel is the way they cater for children. When you consider going to visit Disney world in Florida, one of the main considerations will be costs, but when you take everything into consideration, the extra money you spend on a Disney hotel is totally worth it.

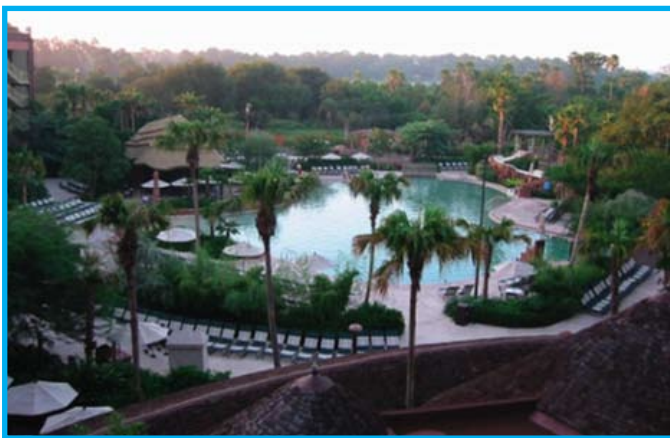
The Animal Kingdom Lodge provides so many extra activities for children that it truly makes it something special. At dusk children can borrow night vision goggles and look at the animals directly from the hotel grounds onto the savannahs, to truly get an appreciation of the wildlife. There are always friendly guides on hand to explain more about animal behavior. This is nice little touch to the after dinner experience. It's like going on a night time safari.

During the day there are often activities for the children. If it's wet, then out comes the arts and craft supplies and the beautiful Animal Kingdom Lodge lobby is turned into a giant play area for the children, encouraging them to take part in new crafting projects.

Make sure to check out the notice board by the Boma restaurant for list of daily activities and their scheduled times.



The 360 pool at the Animal Kingdom lodge is themed like a little oasis in South Africa. Surrounded by palm trees the Uzima pool has zero entry on one side and so is most suitable for disabled guests.

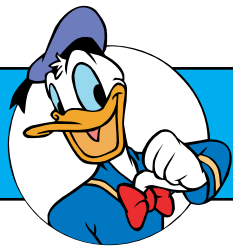
At most times of the day you will find three lifeguards on duty to assist any swimmer in the 9,000-square-foot, themed feature pool. There are views of the savannah and nestled away in the

shrubbery on the side of the main pool are two warm bubbling spas. There is also a small children's play area and a children's pool as you would expect, located close to the restrooms for ease of use.

At the animal Kingdom lodge poolside, you will find a bar in keeping with the theme, complete with African style thatched roof. The bar serves delicious smoothies both alcoholic and non-alcoholic.

Towels are provided in the animal kingdom lodge at pool-side, so there is no need to take towels from your room or pack extra large beach towels when vacationing here. Adjacent to the pool, again neatly tucked away out of view, is a massage and fitness centre.

When the little ones have had enough of the pool, try Simba's club house, they provide excellent childcare, with all the facilities that you would expect. They will even provide meals so that parents can have a romantic evening alone. And for the older children, check out the small amusement arcade which provides all the usual video games.

The poolside experience at the animal Kingdom lodge is a relaxing and very different to any other Disney hotel. It's a great experience for both adults and children and is a welcome rest from the theme parks.

Animal Kingdom Lodge Rooms

The interior decor at the Animal Kingdom Lodge is well thought out and typifies all that you associate with staying in an African lodge on safari. The beds have carved wooden headboards giving an authentic feel, and the comforters have a colorful, almost patchwork quilt like design that covers a symbolic African theme. Each of the rooms feature hand-crafted furniture and art, made from rich woods and vibrant colors.



Accommodation at the Animal Kingdom Lodge ranges in size from standard rooms to one and two bedroom suites. Rooms are available with bunk beds and roll away beds.

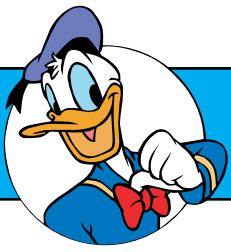
The bathrooms at the Animal Kingdom Lodge are well designed with both a shower and a shallow bath, and just outside the bathroom area there are two separate wash basins to alleviate congestion in the morning.

Take advantage of the balconies view if your room has one, as the Animal Kingdom Lodge has 24 hours viewing opportunities to see animals in their habitat. A great time to catch them is in the evening or early morning. In fact one of the best memories that you can take away with you from the Animal Kingdom Lodge is to sit having breakfast out on your balconies overlooking one the beautiful Savannahs and enjoying seeing the giraffes take their feed.

Animal Kingdom Lodge Dining

Dinning at the Animal Kingdom lodge is a wonderful experience; a real culinary adventure. There is something for everyone, and as you would expect from a Disney hotel, children are thoroughly spoiled.

Eat breakfast at The Mara where you can pick up a selection of bagels, pastries plus cereal and fruits, or take a trip to the Boma restaurant. This self service buffet style

restaurant provides a feast that will more than keep you going until lunch time. The safari breakfast consists of eggs bacon and hash browns, and if that isn't enough try the wonderful pancakes with delightful maple syrup that is to die for.



When you are not the theme parks, the Animal Kingdom lodge serves food all day long. Try a delicious club sandwich made from thick bread rolls and juicy chicken breast. Or call in at the Mara for a wonderful section of fast food, from burgers and pizza, to healthy wraps and fresh fruit salad. And if that is not enough go to the Boma restaurant for meal that

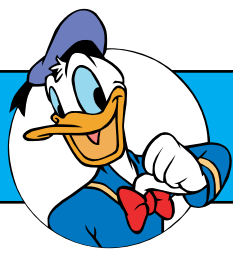
will more than likely take the rest of the afternoon to consume.

In evenings take a trip to the Jiko the cooking place which features cuisines from around the world and a South African wine list which would put most exclusive restaurant to shame. Don't worry about the children, there are always favorites like peanut butter and jelly sandwiches.

The Jiko Disney dining experience was designed by Jeffrey Beers and inspired by the Disney movie The Lion King. Twin wood burning ovens are the centerpiece of the open kitchen.

Once you have completed your meal take coffee in the seductive Victoria Falls bar overlooking Boma. You can take dessert here if you wish, sample more African wine or relax with a gourmet coffee.

With the adjacent hotel lobby lounge catering for children with large and tastefully integrated TVs playing Disney Cartoons, you know that you children will be in good hands.

There is nothing like staying at a Walt Disney Resort to make your vacation that much more magical. What's the allure of staying onsite if you hardly plan to be in your room or on the resort property? Why spend the extra money on a beautiful room when all you plan to do is play in the parks?

Disney Transportation

Disney transportation is free to guests staying onsite. The first time I ever went to Disney World my family and I stayed off property. The off property site advertised being only 1 mile from the main gate. Plus, they provided FREE transportation to the parks! When we arrive though, we found that Disney property is approximately twice the square miles of Manhattan and Magic Kingdom is about a 20 minute drive from the main gate. Not only that, but that transportation only took you to a hub and then you had to travel to each respective park, almost doubling travel time. Also, the transportation didn't run all day, and was spotty at best. We were sorely disappointed. Disney runs busses, boats and monorail direct from your Disney resort straight to the gates of each park! The busses run frequently and have long hours and usually you never have to wait more than 15 minutes. This is definitely a reason to stay on property.

The Magic

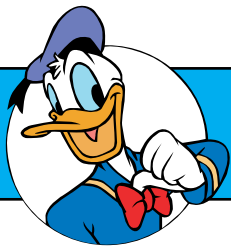
There is nothing like staying on property and enjoying the Disney magic 24/7! This is not a touchable or definable amenity, but more of a feeling. It allows you to extend your stay from the parks into your room. This includes 24 hour park TV in the room and whimsical décor in some resorts. The other more refined Disney resorts place you in the middle of a wonderful theme, like South Pacific Islands or a New England Boardwalk. The thought and detail of your day in the park continues on to your relaxing night.

The Pool

Every Disney resort has themed pools, some with wonderful elaborate slides. Even if you plan to be in the park all day, a nighttime swim or early morning pick-me-up has some allure. The magic can continue even if you are only taking it in for an hour in the afternoon before your nap.

Food Courts

All Disney resorts have food courts where you can pick up a snack or a full meal for breakfast, lunch or dinner. The food is affordable and delicious! When better to snag yourself a tie dye cheesecake than at your stay at Disney's Pop Century Resort. Also, don't forget the refillable mugs you can purchase at any resort and refill



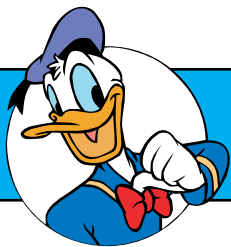

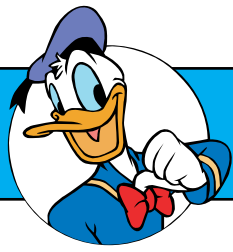


DISNEY'S MAGICAL EXPRESS



Arriving at a large International airport like Orlando's MCO can be a stressful, harried experience. Trying to juggle the kids and the luggage all the while searching for a ride to your resort is not a great way to begin any vacation.

In 2005, Disney came up with a solution to the stressful airport experience. Their answer was the "Magical Express". The Magical Express (ME for short) is a FREE airport shuttle available to all Disney resort guests. When you arrive at MCO you simply follow the signs directing you to the ME. When you've reached the ME area Disney Cast Members will warmly welcome you to Orlando Florida and direct you down the red carpet. Before you know it you will find yourself boarding a comfortable air-conditioned tour bus headed to the Happiest Place on Earth. The ride is a short one but you'll be

entertained by a video featuring Mickey and the Gang. Your driver will soon have you to your chosen resort. When the trip is over the ME will pick you up, about 3 hours before your flight, and return you safely to MCO.

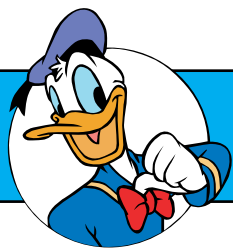


How can you take advantage of this wonderful FREE service? Simply contact your WDWTravels agent and she'll be happy to set this up free of charge. All she'll need is your flight info and a few weeks before your trip you'll get a Magical Express packet in the mail. The packet will contain your ME passes and luggage tags. Yes luggage tags! You'll place these on your bags and when you check your luggage at your home airport you'll say "Bon Voyage" to your luggage and the next time you see it will be in your Disney resort!

Another service included in ME is resort airline check-in. Select airlines will allow you to check in for your return flight right at your resort! That means no waiting at the airport check in! They'll even take your checked bag and you'll see it again when you return to your home airport.

Disney sure takes the work out of your airport experience, don't they?!

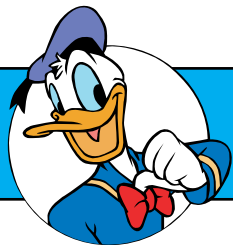

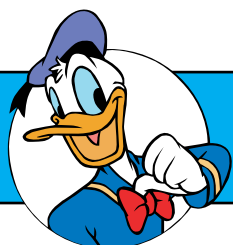
MATCHING CLOTHES

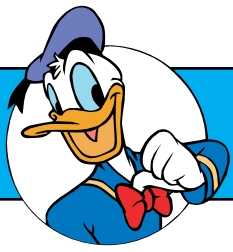


PLANNING A GRAND GATHERING

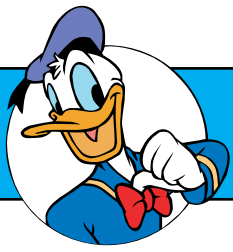

The past couple of issues we have had quite a focus on dining when it comes to your Disney vacation. However, we really haven't offered you many first hand experiences when it comes to one of the most important parts of your vacation. Let's take a dive into some of the best dining options that Walt Disney World has to offer.

Whether we realize it or not, dining is a very important part of our Disney vacation experience. Some of us prefer to just go with the quick service options and get back to our sight seeing, while others prefer to go with the table service options and savor every little bit we can of the Disney magic. One thing is certain though, and that is no matter which side of the line you fall on, we all love good food.

Over the next few issues, I will be bringing you some reviews of what I consider to be some of the best quick service and table service dining options that the Walt Disney World Resort has to offer. Each article will be broken down by park, and will hopefully give you all some ideas when it comes to planning your next Disney vacation. We begin with the park that started it all back in 1971, the Magic Kingdom.

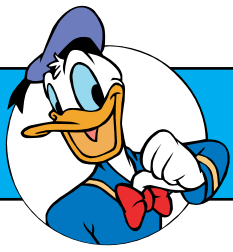
The Magic Kingdom has many different options when it comes to dining for both the quick service and the table service diners, 26 different options to be precise. However, I won't be able to cover every single option in this series of articles.



We will start this article off with the quick service options that the Magic Kingdom has to offer. Beginning on Main Street USA we have Casey's Corner. Casey's Corner is your typical hot dog stand themed to the story of Casey at the Bat. The menu at Casey's Corner consists of hot dogs, corn dogs, french fries, and beverages. Meals here aren't very expensive and are usually a favorite for the younger ones in your party.

Moving over into Tomorrowland we have one of my personal favorite quick service restaurants in all of the Walt Disney World Resort, Cosmic Ray's Starlight Café. Now this is one of my favorite quick service restaurants for 2 main reasons, 1, the atmosphere is very inviting here, and 2, there are many different options for guests to eat here. In fact, Cosmic Ray's has 3 different "Bays" for you to choose

from. Each of these bays offers a different style of food. One bay offers burgers and items of that sort, another offers chicken, and the third offers soups and salads. There's something here that almost every person in your party will enjoy. While you enjoy your food here, you are sure to be entertained by none other than Sonny Eclipse from the planet Zork, along with his backup singers, the Space Angels. Food prices here, much like at Casey's Corner are very reasonable. If your vacation lands during a busy season, expect long waits at Cosmic Ray's. This is the second largest indoor fast food restaurant in the world, with the largest being a McDonalds in Moscow.



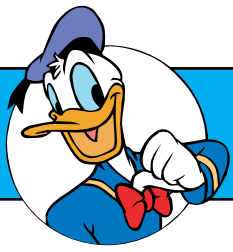
Over in Fantasyland we have The Pinocchio Village Haus, which serves up salads, pizza, and chicken nuggets. If you're little ones are looking for a great spot to eat and view it's a small world this is the place to do it. With windows that overlook into the loading area of small world you can get a bird's eye view of the attraction. It may be a little difficult to keep your little ones focused long enough to finish their lunches though.

In Frontierland we have my other personal favorite in the Magic Kingdom, Pecos Bill Tall Tale Inn & Café. This quick service location offers up burgers, wrapped sandwiches, and salads, with plenty of space to sit, 2 floors to be precise. (Although the upstairs is not always open.) You can find this location right next door to The Country Bear Jamboree. Being towards the back of the park, it offers up a great place to rest your legs during the day.

Operating seasonally in Adventureland we have El Pirata y el Perico Restaurant, which translates to The Pirate and the Parrot Restaurant. This beautifully themed restaurant looks like an extension of the attraction it sits across, Pirates of the Caribbean. Serving a Mexican cuisine including taco salads and burritos, this quick service restaurant is often seen open during peak seasons only.



One last quick service location that is worth mentioning is a favorite among many people, especially Disney enthusiasts, Aloha Isle. Located in Adventureland near the bridge to Main Street USA, this counter service establishment offers a very unique snack that has been bringing people back for more

for decades. Although it may sound a bit odd, Pineapple Dole Whip is the star of the attraction here, and is served in a few different styles. You can get a soft serve cone of either pineapple, chocolate, vanilla, or a swirl of either pineapple and vanilla or chocolate and vanilla ice creams. They also have pineapple floats, root beer floats, and Coca-Cola floats.

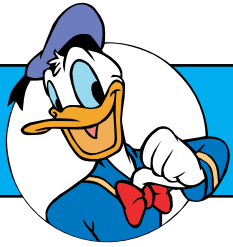


Of course there are more than just quick service dining options in the Magic Kingdom, and one of my family's personal favorites is the Crystal Palace located between main Street USA and Adventureland. This buffet style restaurant offers a typical grouping of foods for a Disney buffet. However, the thing that keeps people coming back here vacation after vacation is the characters. This meal allows you to get your picture taken with and meet your favorite Winnie the Pooh characters including Tigger, Piglet, Eeyore, and

Pooh Bear himself. The food here is good, but it's really the character dining experience that brings people back.

Another table service option at the Magic Kingdom that is popular among families is Cinderella's Royal Table. More popular among the families with girls, this character dining meal features a majority of the princesses with excellent and tasty options for food. This meal is a bit pricier than the others, and if you are on the Disney Dining Plan will cost 2 table service coupons. I can honestly say though that I believe it is worth it at least once. Even if you don't have any kids that are of the age that would enjoy it, it really is a beautiful meal overlooking Fantasyland.

That just about does it for part 1 of this multi-part series of restaurant reviews from the Walt Disney World Resort. Be sure to check back next month as I review another park and some of the many dining options that it has to offer.

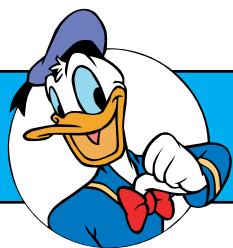

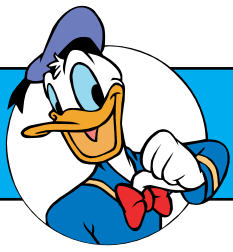

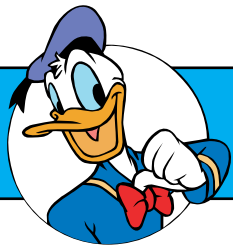
